FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The great American theologian Reinhold Niebuhr once said that when it comes to Christmas, sermons don't quite cut it. The topic is too heavy. He said that we preachers are better off leaving it to the poets and musicians, who have a way of expressing and celebrating truth in meaningful ways when our ordinary words fall short. When it comes to Christmas, we know deep down that some of the very best and most meaningful expressions of the incarnation come in music and song.

Scripture points us in that direction as well. Mary, when visiting her cousin Elizabeth, broke out into song when she heard Elizabeth's greeting. Perhaps mere words simply couldn't express all that she was feeling about the coming birth of her new baby. When the shepherds were keeping watch in their fields, the good news of Jesus' birth was proclaimed to them in song, as the heavens burst open with an angel chorus singing of God's glory. And of course, when it comes to the "wise men" it's hard to listen to their story without also hearing the words, "*we three kings of orient are... bearing gifts we traverse afar...*"

If you think about it, the entire Christmas season revolves around music, doesn't it? How do you get that first indication that Christmas is coming? Well, you walk into the store in October and hear those first notes of "Deck the Halls" playing in the rafters above, right? In what other time of the year do we scan our radios for Christmas music, or open an entire box of CDs devoted to the season, or stream the Christmas radio stations on our tablets, smart phones, and TVs? And how many Christmas albums does Michael Buble have, anyway? At Christmas, music takes its place at the center of our celebration, and perhaps that's because nothing else captures the beauty, and the joy, and sheer mystery of Christ's birth quite like music, does it? As I reflect on the many ways that my own Advent journey is punctuated by music, I would suggest to you that all of the Advent and Christmas music that is so dear and so meaningful to us, is special not because of tradition or nostalgia or prevalence in our culture. It's special to us because it reminds us, again and again, what this journey is all about. It's not really about the presents. It's not really about the surprises in the stockings, or the family dinners, or the evergreen trees. What it's really about is that great mystery in which God came to us in the birth of a child in a manger. It's about the "Word of the Father, now in flesh appearing..." It's about the resounding joy that has come to the world, for the Savior reigns... It's about the one who rules the world, with truth and grace... and makes the nations prove the glories of his righteousness, and wonders of his love... It's about the song that God is singing to us this very day. And yes, even as we are singing God's praises, if we listen, we will hear the music in the manger... that sweet sound of God's song of salvation... *Peace on earth, and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled...*

FINANCIAL PEACE

UNIVERSITY returns to FPC
